

## 1988 HAHN ENGINE



The 1988 Hahn was one of the last units to roll off the assembly line before the Hahn plant closed. It was delivered in November of 1987 at a cost of \$154,000. The chassis holds a 5-man cab and is powered by a 350 horsepower Detroit Diesel and an automatic transmission. It carries 1000 gallons of water has a 1250 gpm pump and an on board generator. Preconnected lines include 2-1½" x 150' cross lays, 2-1½" x 150' lays in the hose bed along with a 2½" x 150' lay and 1200' of 4" supply line. It has a 4" front intake and 2 - 4" side intakes. Among the equipment it carries are extension ladders, exhaust and ppv fans, forcible entry tools and a Lukas vehicle rescue tool. The 1988 Hahn Engine replaced the 1948 Mack Engine. It was taken out of service on August 1, 2013 and later sold to the Koontz Lake Oregon Township Fire Department in Walkerton, Indiana for \$10,500.
